This questionnaire will not be made public.

Please do not discuss the questionnaire or your answers with anyone. It is very important that the answers be yours and yours alone. Remember that there are no "right" or "wrong" answers; only truthful answers. You are sworn to give true and complete answers to all questions. Also, do not conduct any independent research on this case.

You may complete the questionnaire electronically and return it to the Court via e-mail following the instructions below, or you may complete the paper form and return it to the Court in the enclosed postage-paid envelope.

You are required to respond to the summons and complete the questionnaire within five days of receipt.
