You are a prospective juror for the case listed above. This questionnaire is designed to obtain information about you to use in deciding your qualifications to serve as a juror in this case. The purpose of these questions is to determine whether prospective jurors can impartially decide this case based upon the evidence presented at trial and the instructions on the law given by the presiding judge. The questions are not intended to unnecessarily inquire into personal matters; all information obtained will be kept confidential.

You are sworn to give true and complete answers. Your answers will be available only to the Court and the parties. The questionnaires belong to the Court and all copies will be returned to the Court. You are instructed not to discuss this case or the questionnaire with anyone, including your family, fellow jurors, or anyone else.

Although some of the questions may appear to be of a personal nature, please understand that the Court and the parties must learn enough information about each juror's background and experiences to select a fair and impartial jury. Your cooperation is of vital importance. Please answer each question as fully and completely as possible. Your complete candor and honesty are necessary so that both the prosecution and the defense will have a meaningful opportunity to select an impartial jury.

You must answer all the questions to the best of your ability. If you do not know the answer to a question, write, "I don't know." If the question does not apply to you, write "N/A." Please fill out the entire Questionnaire. **DO NOT LEAVE ANY QUESTION BLANK.** It is important that the answers be yours alone. If you need more space for your responses or wish to make further comments regarding any of your answers, please use the Explanation Sheet at the end of the questionnaire. Put the number of the question you are answering on the Explanation Sheet before you write your response or comment.

Please keep in mind that there are no "right" or "wrong" answers, only complete and incomplete answers. Complete answers are far more helpful than incomplete answers. Remember, *you are sworn to give true and complete answers to all questions.*

Unless the question states otherwise, the fact that a particular question is asked does not imply that the subject matter of the question is an issue in this case. As you read the questions, you are not to draw any inferences about the issues which must be decided in this case. Do not write on the back of any page. **PLEASE PRINT OR WRITE LEGIBLY.**

The Government has charged defendants Mark Leroy Dencklau, Kenneth Earl Hause, and Chad Leroy Erickson with being members or associates of the Gypsy Joker Motorcycle Club, an alleged criminal enterprise engaged in acts relating to murder, kidnapping, robbery, extortion, distribution of controlled substances, and witness tampering. Defendants Dencklau and Erickson are charged with the murder and kidnapping of Robert Huggins in aid of the charged racketeering enterprise. Defendant Hause is charged with conspiracy to participate in a racketeering enterprise.

The charges are not any evidence of guilt; there is a presumption of innocence applicable to each defendant on each charge. The defendants have each entered a plea of not guilty to these charges.

The jury in this case will be asked to listen to the evidence presented in court and make their decision based **ONLY** on the evidence they hear in court. As a member of this jury panel, you are instructed that you **MUST NOT** do any research of any kind in relation to this case and must not talk to anyone else about it. You are not allowed to:

- Read or research anything related to this case.
- Listen to any discussion related to this case.
- Talk to **anyone** about this case, including your spouse/partner and other family members.

You must not do any reading or talking about the case. You must answer truthfully and honestly.

These procedures are necessary to ensure a fair trial for all parties. Thank you for your cooperation.

I hereby state under penalty of perjury that all the answers given by me in this Juror Questionnaire are true, correct, and complete to the best of my knowledge.

Because I am a potential juror in this case, I agree not to do any research, investigation, or reading, on either the Internet or anywhere else, that may relate to any of the issues or names mentioned in this questionnaire. I also agree not to discuss anything about this case, share any information about this case, or even listen to anyone about this case unless I am expressly instructed or permitted to do so by the Judge.

It is expected that this trial will last approximately six weeks, beginning October 4, 2021. There will be no trial on Monday, October 11. The hours of the trial will typically be 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Jurors will be paid an attendance fee of \$50 per day, roundtrip mileage reimbursement at \$0.56 per mile, and, if applicable, parking reimbursement of \$18.00 per day. Long-distance jurors residing 75 or more miles from the courthouse may also be reimbursed for travel expenses as outlined in the Long-Distance Juror Information Sheet included with the Summons for Jury Service. Jury service is one of the highest duties and privileges of a United States citizen. The participation of people like yourself is essential to the proper administration of justice. The Court recognizes that not everyone can serve on a case of this length. However, mere inconvenience or the usual financial hardships of jury service will not be enough to excuse you from service. You must show that service as a juror in this case would cause an undue or extreme personal hardship. With this in mind, please answer the following questions.
